The Patriot Flag (30 x 55.5 foot and weighs 75 pounds) is touring the United States in honor of the fallen on 9/11/01.

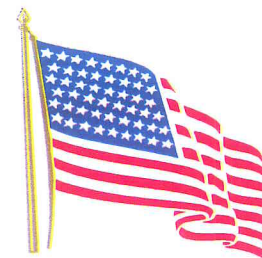
It was donated to the WORLD MEMORIAL by a group of businessmen (Escondido Auto Park Association) from Escondido, CA through the American Legion Post J.B. Clark Post 149. It began as an idea at a funeral for a WWII Veteran in Oceanside, CA and has evolved into a national project of patriotism.

The cross country tour began in San Diego on September 10, 2010 and ends back in San Diego on September 2, 2011. It will be flown in 50 states in 50 weeks. Check the website for locations.

On 9/11/11, the flag will fly at the Flight 93 Rose Garden in Shanksville, PA, the Pentagon in Arlington, VA and the Manhattan Battery Park in New York City.

An official retirement ceremony will be performed in Escondido, CA and then the flag will be placed on display in an appropriate honorable location to be announced.
